



BIENNIAL RESEARCH REPORT (2017 – 2019)

Highlighting Research Activities of Departments, and Faculty Members

For the past two years, 2017 – 2019, the Faculty of Arts has made tremendous progress in pursuance of its mandate in teaching, research, learning and community service, by making its programmes and products more responsive locally, and competitive globally. Similarly, the Faculty has consistently embarked on repositioning of its academic Departments by way of organizing international conferences, workshops, and seminars, for the purpose of ensuring cutting edge researches, and to sustain programme and research adaptation to the reality, as well as demands of the times. These have consistently been achieved through capacity building, among other things, of faculty members. In January 2018, the Faculty organized a three-day workshop on Effective Teaching and Ethics.

Resource personnel were invited from the USA, UK, and from the University of Ibadan. The workshop was aimed at improving the quality of teaching, effective knowledge transmission and information dissemination. One of the achievements of the workshop was making teaching in the classroom student-centred, for effectiveness. Besides, staff are encouraged to apply for special support fund of the university to enable them attend local and international conferences. They also have opportunity to access other similar sources for funding support, including TETFund. The early career researchers enjoy full sponsorship to pursue their doctoral programmes locally, or abroad, attend seminars and workshops, as well as short fellowship in overseas institutions.

In the Master's degree programmes, students enjoy excellent training, while doctoral students have access to programmes covering a wide range of subject areas, and they are encouraged to engage in research across disciplinary boundaries. In addition, part of the efforts of the Faculty is in promoting research networking across disciplines (local), and the globe. To date, there is hardly any Department with less than three Professors; the Department of English alone, for example, has, at the last count, 15 Professors. The import of this is the impact such a coterie of scholars have on the quality of teaching, translational research and mentoring, in the Departments and the Faculty. This document is largely representational, covering the bulk of research activities carried out by faculty members in the last two years. This is with the hope that it will help to motivate, and inspire more researches my faculty members, as well as inform the public on completed researches and ongoing academic activities in the Faculty. In addition, the ongoing research activities also point in the direction research activities are headed in the Faculty, the purpose of which include transforming and advancing scholarship in the Arts and Humanities. 
